Walking Big Book By June N

Sometimes, the person who carries the message of sobriety does not get to see you step into the rooms. This happened in my case. When I was in college and barely holding on, I had an experience with an instructor who has affected me for the rest of my life.

I had a nine o'clock in the morning class with the most loved and admired teacher in the photography department. Dick was an older gentleman who took the time out of retirement to teach a couple of classes at the university I was attending. Everyone loved Dick, including me.

At the time, my life was not going well. I had an on-and-off again relationship with my current "him", my father was in the hospital in a comatose state (as a direct result of alcoholism), and my drinking was spiraling out of control. Just to walk into class on this particular morning, I drank a half bottle of cheap wine and took a couple of "relaxing pills". After class that day, Dick took me aside and said he wanted to talk. He asked me if things weren't working in my life. I saw this as an invitation to get some sympathy, so of course, I said my life was horrible. I loved being a victim. He asked me a few more questions about how terrible my situation was. I was eating up the pity I felt I was getting. Then he told me he was a sober member of Alcoholics Anonymous and would I like to go to a meeting with him. I was shocked.

Attendance: Jay M. (Chair), Lisa F. (Co-Chair), Mike C. (CFO/Treasurer), Sam L. (Member at Large). Zoom hosted by Becky J. (Central Office Assistant). 35 intergroup reps present (24 on Zoom, 11 in the room).

Traditions

Read by Manny. The Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous were read to open the meeting.

Prior Meeting Minutes

Read by Lisa F. The meeting was called to order by Jay. Minutes can be viewed and printed from the North County AA website at ncsandiegoaa.org under the Viewpoint.

Two amendments were noted:

- The AA fellowship/special event on June 27th runs from 4:00 to 8:00 p.m. The location is 800 W. Mission Rd San Marcos 92069 (correcting the time and location shown in the draft).
- The negative signs on the group-contributions line should be removed; a negative against a decline incorrectly adds to the total.

Motion to approve the minutes as amended was made and seconded. Approved — no opposition (no hands raised on Zoom).

Financial Report

Mike C. presented the finances for the month of May:

- Total sales: \$3,516 | Cost of goods sold: \$3,021 | Gross profit on sales: \$494
- Group contributions: \$3,558 (about \$3,500 below the prior month)
- Member contributions: \$1,303 (about \$700 above the prior month)
- Bank interest earned: \$254 | Total other revenue: \$5,114
- Total revenue: \$5,609 | Total operating expense: \$9,567
- Net loss for the month: \$3,958 | Year-to-date loss: \$28,156

Prudent reserve:

- Money market: dropped from \$10,462 to \$1,932 (used to replenish the checking account).
- CD #3371 (9-mo., matures September): \$22,563
- CD #3678 (matures October): \$22,533
- CD #4064 (matures November): \$22,565
- CD #3151 (7-mo., matures July): \$22,540 — will not be renewed; funds will move to the money market.
- CD total: \$90,202 | Total prudent reserve funds: \$92,134
- Business checking: \$27,951 | Special events checking: \$5,015
- Current-month operating expense: \$9,567 | Months in reserve: 10

Jay added context on the contributions decline: compared with the same month last year (\$9,587), May group contributions were down more than \$6,000; the prior month was about \$1,900 under. He attributed part of the drop to the Business Committee's effort to spend down a roughly \$50,000 surplus — which had been mentioned at nearly every intergroup meeting, leaving an impression that intergroup "has plenty of money." He asked reps to help correct that perception. After next month's CD withdrawal the prudent reserve will sit

near 9 months, which he considers a healthy level, and he encouraged groups to stay active in their contributions.

Motion to approve the financials as submitted was made and seconded. Approved — no opposition.

- Recommended qualification is one year of sobriety for both the call list and 12-step list; less has been allowed after discussion with a sponsor.

The committee is still seeking a chair. Jay read the qualifications: the Archives Committee is responsible for collecting and managing the history of AA in North San Diego County and safeguarding all archival materials. Chairperson: 5 years of sobriety; suggested 3-year term. Duties include recruiting committee members, scheduling meetings, collecting and maintaining archives, and presenting new projects (and any with financial impact) to the Business Committee. Materials are stored in the Central Office storage area, not at a member's home. (See Elections — the position was filled at this meeting.)

- Encouraged reps to share the service pamphlets/brochures found at literature tables and Central Office in Vista, and to spread the word about the once-a-month intergroup meeting where reps and committee chairs gather.
- Highlighted a flyer (developed with Laura, Liz, and Jay) about the weak rep-to-group ratio: roughly 726 AA meetings in North County, with fewer than about 60 represented by intergroup reps each month.
- Will host an outreach table at the June 27th event with literature and refreshments (water, soda, chips); noted his Business Committee request may not have arrived on time.
- Asked for networking help from members in other North County cities. The Viewpoint carries committee contact information, dates, and times.

- Tyler will staff a PI table at the free event on Saturday, June 27th — visitors welcome to stop by and see what PI does.
- Jay encouraged service at PI tables, noting a statistic that about 92% of people who die of alcohol-related causes never attended an AA meeting; he flagged anonymity as the one consideration for those uncomfortable being seen in public.
- The June 27th event was clarified for Intergroup members on zoom: bands, food, and fellowship 4:00–8:00 p.m. with the meeting 6:30–7:30 p.m., at 800 W. Mission Ave, San Marcos.

Founders' Day 6-10-2026

The History of Founders' Day:

Founders' Day has been an important part of the history of Alcoholics Anonymous. Our current celebration has its roots from our humble beginnings. Here are a few events which have helped shape our annual Founders' Day celebration.

1941 Bill W. and Dr. Bob were the featured speakers.

1942 Dr. Bob traced the early history of our movement, introduced early members, followed by a buffet supper served by wives of Akron Group #1.

1945 Dr. Bob and Bill W. spoke at a dinner at the Mayflower Ballroom.

1945 A modest celebration was held at the M. O'Neil Auditorium with the co-founders present.

1947 Dr. Bob and A.A. #3 Bill D. were the speakers.

1948 The Akron Armory was used and talks were given by Dr. Walter Tunks, Bill W. and Dr. Bob.

1951 Dr. Bob had died. An open house was held at 855 Ardmore. (Dr. Bob's Home) Bill spoke at the Goodyear Theater.

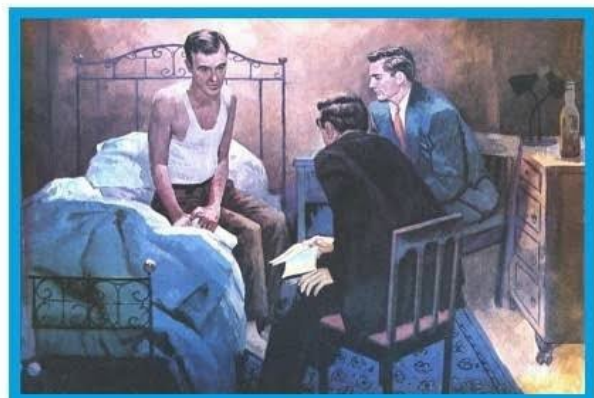
1953 Bill W. attended an open house at St. Thomas Hospital.

1957 The first "Play" was introduced and a Sunday morning breakfast was held at The University of Akron's Memorial Hall.

1958 Bill W. his wife Lois W. and Ethel M. were speakers at The University of Akron's Memorial Hall.

1961 This was the start of the memorial for Dr. Bob at 9:00 am.

1965 The "Modern" Era of Founders' Day begins with the first Friday-Sunday Weekend. Founders' Day is an integral part of the legacy our co-founders have left for us. Founders' Day has grown to where 10,000 visitors from around the world come each year. Please come to Akron to see, to feel, and to be part of The Fellowship of the Spirit.

First that he was an alcoholic because he seemed so nice. Second, he would think I was an alcoholic! So of course I declined his offer. What he said and did next is very important. He said if I ever changed my mind just call and he would be happy to take me to a meeting. Then he never mentioned AA again. He never preached or brought up my drinking. It stuck in my head that people in AA looked and acted like Dick S. He was my example and a walking Big Book.

Years later when I had nowhere else to go but Alcoholics Anonymous, Dick S was who I thought of. I picked up the phone and the local central office where I was living. I have not had a drink since that first meeting I attended. I waited to call Dick until I had a whole year of sobriety. I was so sick I didn't know if I would make it. But when I had my year, I picked up the phone and called back east to Michigan. When I told him that he was my example of Alcoholics Anonymous and I thanked him, he cried. He said that he was grateful that I found the program and that he had a small part in my finding my way to sobriety, that God works through people.

That was almost forty-four years ago.

I have had the opportunity to teach in a classroom. There have been times when I've offered to take a student to a meeting with me and other times when I've seen a student at a meeting and I've reached out a hand. I try to remember that there may be a time that I may be the only example of Alcoholics Anonymous a person may ever see. I'm not perfect but I strive to be like my example of a walking Big Book.

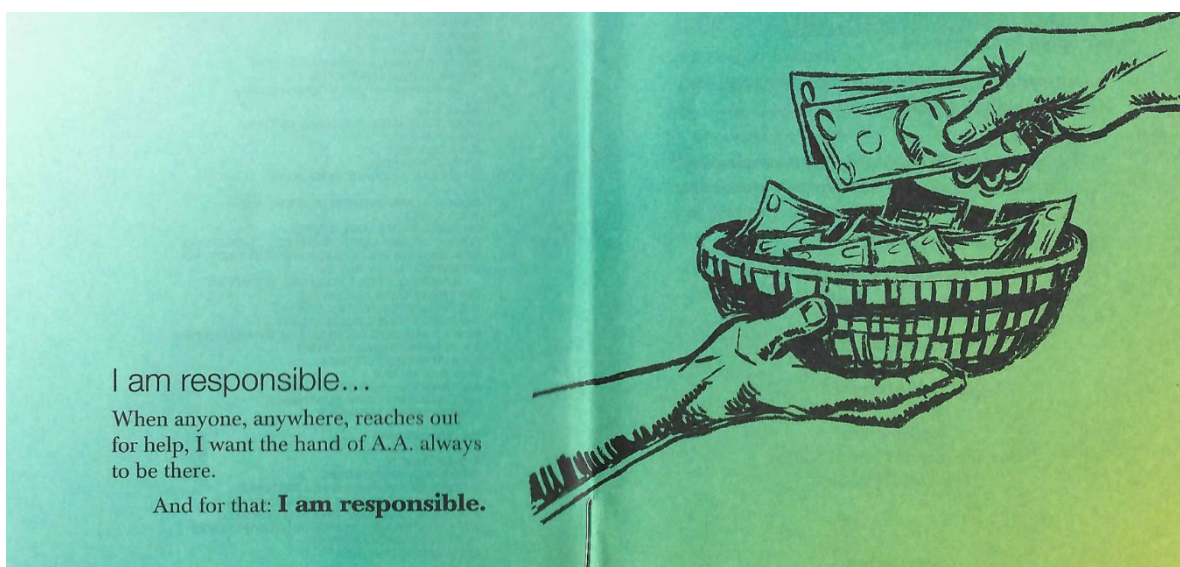
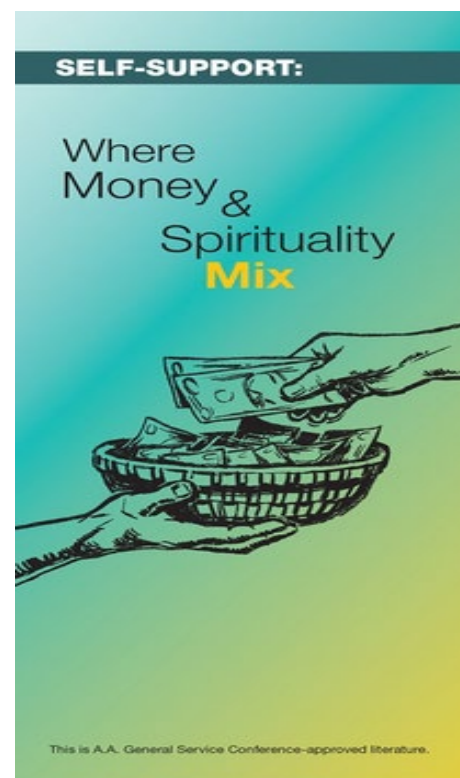
